

Reverend Dr. T. Eric Nathan is a native of Columbus, Georgia; however, the formative years of his childhood were spent under the watchful care of his grandmother in Phenix City, Ala. His Christian experience stems from an ecumenical structure that bridges the denominational traditions of the Catholic, Baptist,

and Methodist churches into one. To be sure, as a youth, Dr. Nathan was baptized and became an active member of Gaines Chapel African Methodist Episcopal Church (Phenix City, Ala).

Licensed to preach in 1987, ordained an Itinerant Elder in 1991. In 1994, he earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Art Education from Alabama A&M University. In 1998, he received the Master of Divinity degree in Christian Education. In 2018, he earned the Doctor of Ministry degree in Pastoral Professionalism & Spiritual Care (Summa Cum Laude) from Turner Theological Seminary at the Interdenominational Theological Center, located in Atlanta, Georgia. His doctoral project is entitled Let's Talk: Using Art to Bridge the Intergenerational Communication Gap Between Elders and Youth of Grant Chapel AME Church in Birmingham, Alabama.

Dr. Nathan has pastored six distinct congregations in East and North Alabama, respectively:

- 1992-1995 Oak Grove A.M.E.C. (Newell, Alabama)
- 1995-1999 St. Paul A.M.E.C. (Lanett, Alabama)

- 2003-2005 Payne Chapel A.M.E.C. (Birmingham, Alabama)

He is currently the pastor of Grant Chapel A.M.E. Church in Birmingham, Alabama, where he has served for the last 20 years.

For the last 22 years, he has served as Dean of the Northwest Alabama Annual Conference Board of Examiners for Ministerial Education.

As his life theme and mantra, Dr. Nathan maintains: "I am the workmanship of God, and I am God's work in progress."
