Reverend Cleitis Walker, Sr. has dedicated more than three decades of his life to preaching the Gospel, with 35 years in ministry and a heartfelt commitment to serving God's people. Since 1995, he has faithfully pastored five congregations across Alabama, including

Saint James AME (9 years), Greater Montrose AME (5 years), Smith Memorial AME (9 years), Mt. Olive AME (2 years), and currently, Gaines Chapel AME Church in Atmore, where he has served joyfully for the past six years.

During the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, Rev. Walker demonstrated unwavering dedication to the Word by preaching from the church's fellowship hall steps for two years via radio. His sermons now continue each Sunday on Facebook Live, reaching hearts far beyond the walls of the sanctuary. Under his leadership, Gaines Chapel is currently undergoing remodeling and safety upgrades to meet 2025 fire code standards, reflecting his vision of both spiritual and physical renewal.

In 2024, Rev. Walker and the Gaines Chapel family proudly hosted the Southwest Alabama Annual Conference, marking a significant milestone in the church's ongoing ministry.
